
Living descendants –

Little Brington School then worked as a labourer for Thomas Threadgold.



November 1917 – joined 7th Battalion, Northants and then transferred to the Buffs
(East Kent Regiment).

Victory Medal and British War Medal.

June 1918 – died from wounds following the Battles of the Lys in Flanders. The third German offensive Operation Georgette takes place in Flanders with the objective of capturing key railway and supply roads and cutting off British Second Army at Ypres. After initial successes the German attack is once again held after British and French reserves are somehow found and deployed.
